AGING LANDSCAPE IN NEW MEXICO

By the year 2030, New Mexico's 65+ population is projected to be **10th highest in the nation**. Currently, we are 13th.* The number of New Mexicans 65+ is expected to **increase by over 200,000** by 2040. That's an increase of **more than 28%** in the next 15 years.**

It is vital that we have right-sized supports in place to serve New Mexicans today and into the future.



For Taos County:

OLDER ADULTS IN THE COUNTY

10,812 residents (31.3%) are aged 65+***

18.5% of residents live at poverty level

1,187 older adults (3.4%) are enrolled in SNAP

1,250 older adults are dual enrolled in Medicare/Medicaid

16.6% of older adults are grandparents raising grandchildren

4 senior centers

2 tribal senior centers

0 adult day care/ services, and **0** are state-funded

1 assisted living facilities, and **0** of them accept Medicaid

1 skilled nursing facilities, and **1** of them accept Medicaid/Medicare

0 tribal adult day care/services

HOW WE SERVED TAOS COUNTY IN FY 2025

AGING SERVICES

- ALTSD, through **4 senior service providers**, served **1,065 county residents** with **107,955 meals** and **3,067 transportation trips**
- **1** contracted organizations using **NM Grown produce** in the county
- **0** tribal organizations using **NM Grown produce** in the county
- **2,598 lbs of food distributed** through NM Grown
- Answered **365 resident calls** through the Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC)
- Provided **8 virtual and in-person informational sessions** on Medicare, Medicaid and state resources

CARE SERVICES

- **17 New Mexicans supported** through the New MexiCare Caregiver Program
- **2 veterans served** through the Veteran-Directed Care Program
- **6 residents served** through Care Transitions Program
- **Kinship Caregiver Pilot Program** is not yet active in Taos County

PROTECTIVE SERVICES

- Adult Protective Services has conducted **124 investigations** into abuse, neglect, and exploitation
- Adult Protective Services received **248 reports** of abuse, neglect and exploitation
- **Self-neglect** is consistently the **top Adult Protective Services concern** statewide

ADVOCACY SERVICES

- The ombudsman **conducted 16 visits** to long-term care facilities in the county. Ombudsman provides advocacy for long-term care residents.
- Led **0 informational, resident rights, and facility trainings** in the county
- Resolved **32 long-term care facility complaints**
- Ombudsman office has a **99% complaint resolution rate**
